The college is getting ready to welcome back our upperclassman along with the incoming class of 2021. Enrollment continues to grow in the College of Agriculture, Food and Environment and our students continue to be among some of the best and brightest to enter this university.

Final figures are weeks away, but our college is set to see a double-digit percent increase in enrollment as well as an increase in underrepresented and minority students. Nearly half of our new students have grade point averages of 3.5 or better and nearly half come from out of state. Obviously this college is doing something right to continue to grow our class size!

4-H to host Solar Eclipse Camp for historic event

The West Kentucky 4-H Camp in Dawson Springs is in the direct path of the total solar eclipse that will occur Aug. 21. [Kentucky 4-H](#) is taking this rare opportunity to host a Solar Eclipse Camp so young people may view the historical event and learn the science behind it. The Solar Eclipse Camp occurs Aug. 18-21 and is open to young people ages nine through 18 from across the United States. Campers will learn about space exploration, astronomy, drones, weather, rockets and telescopes. They will also hear from special guest speakers including meteorologists,



astronomers and a NASA scientist. Campers will also participate in traditional 4-H camping activities including swimming, canoeing and hiking.

Worklife survey

In 2015, the university conducted a survey designed to provide useful information on measures of UK job satisfaction. This fall, the university plans to repeat this survey, using the same questions as in 2015 resulting in comparable data sets.

Approximately 30 percent of the college's faculty and staff completed the 2015 [UK@work Survey](#), and unit leaders with 10 or more responses from their unit, received unit-specific results of the survey. In general, average scores of job satisfaction were higher for our college than the overall "provost units" average, and were higher for staff than for faculty. Unit leaders have been working on at least one measure identified as important to the staff and faculty in the unit.
